This issue contains some established protocols of academic libraries carried out at NMIMS libraries across all the campuses, articles written by library staff, ranking updates, learning databases and much more.

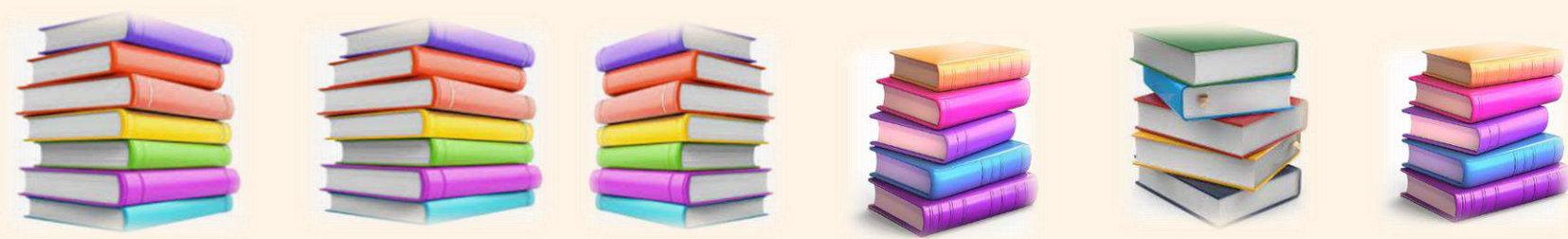

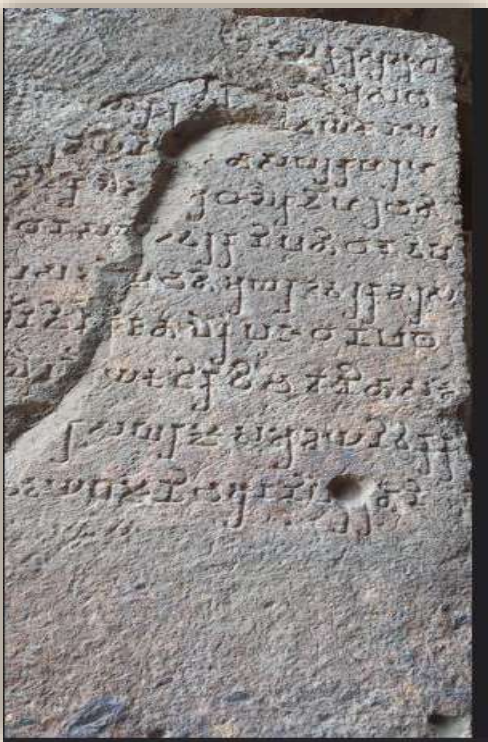

The practice of inscribing on stones and metals transitioned to writing on leather and eventually on paper.

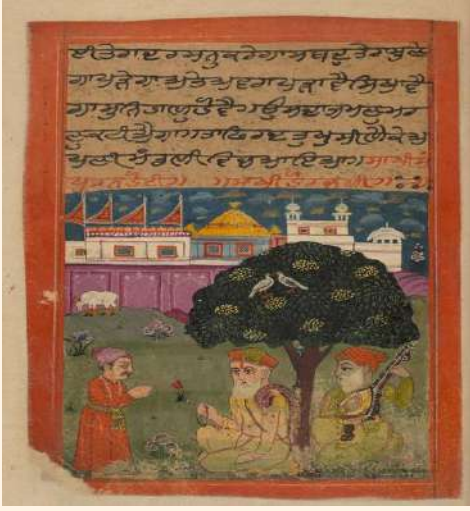

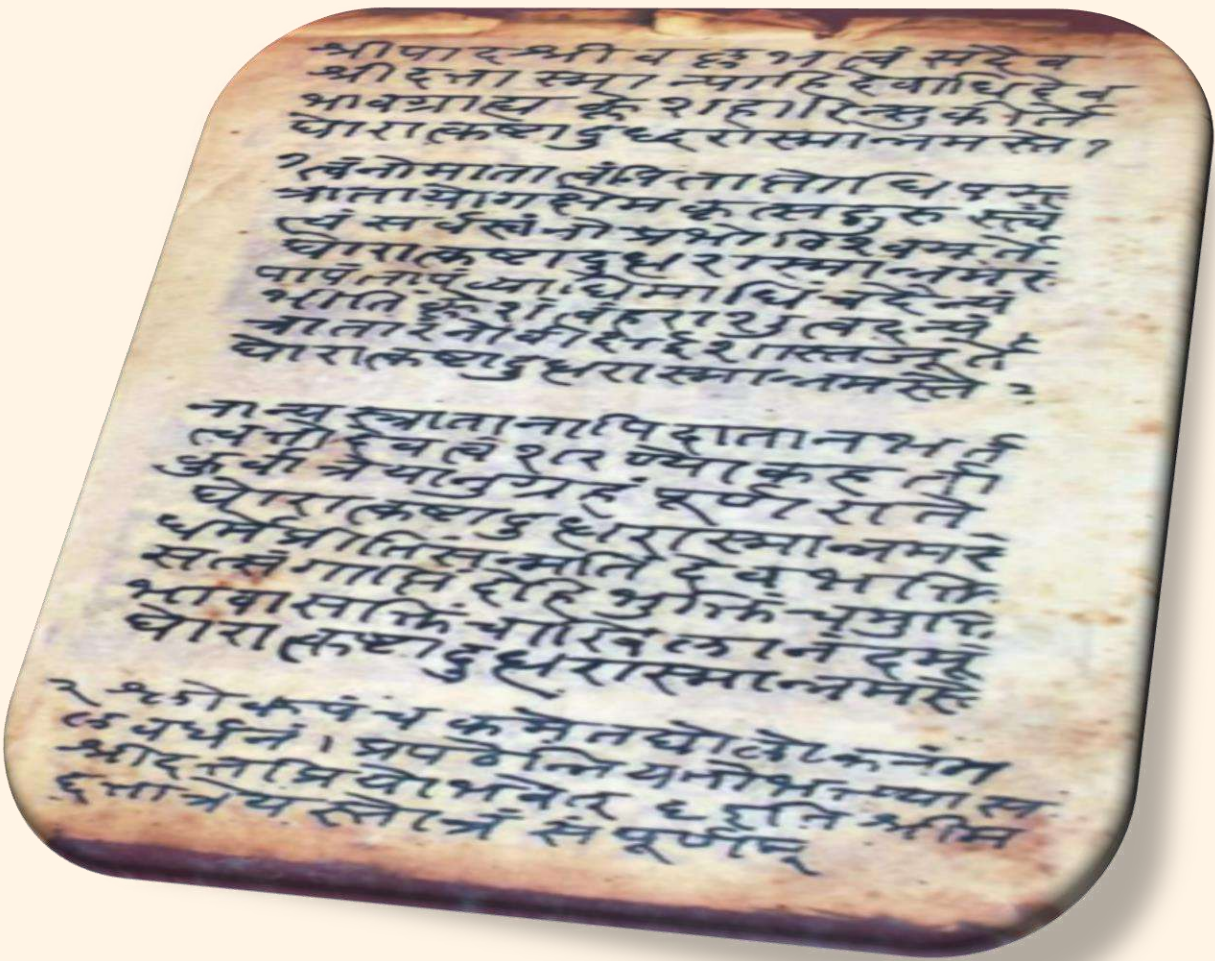

Libraries, which originally served as archives, provided organized spaces for preserving these early written records. They evolved from collections housed in temples and palaces to include both private and public institutions.

The practice of writing on paper eventually evolved into the creation of books and the Gutenberg press, invented by Johannes Gutenberg in the 1430s, was a revolutionary printing device that utilized movable type, enabling the mass production of books. This invention significantly affected the dissemination of information and knowledge through printed works in Europe and beyond, leading to the establishment of

Circa early 19th century handwriting on parchment.

libraries worldwide to preserve these books. Gutenberg's printing press transformed libraries by increasing access to books, expanding readership, and ultimately contributing to the development of public libraries. The ability to produce books in larger quantities and at lower costs allowed libraries to build more extensive collections, making it possible for more people to afford their own books and fostering a more literate society.



The Saraswathi Mahal Library, also known as Thanjavur Maharaja Serfoji's Saraswathi Mahal Library, is one of the few remaining medieval libraries in the world, constructed by the Nayak and Maratha rulers of Thanjavur. More than 49,000 manuscripts, both on paper and on palm leaves, are kept in this library. The manuscripts are written in diverse languages, including Sanskrit, Tamil, Telugu, Marathi, and Manipravalam. The museum features a section with numerous old and rare collections, including ancient medical manuals, the Ramayana, the Mahabharata, and other Sanskrit writings.

Students are advised to self-check their submissions before final submission using the dedicated machines available in the Library & Computer lab.

Once the administrator sends you the invitation link from Copyleaks, you will receive a screen as shown in the attached screenshot.

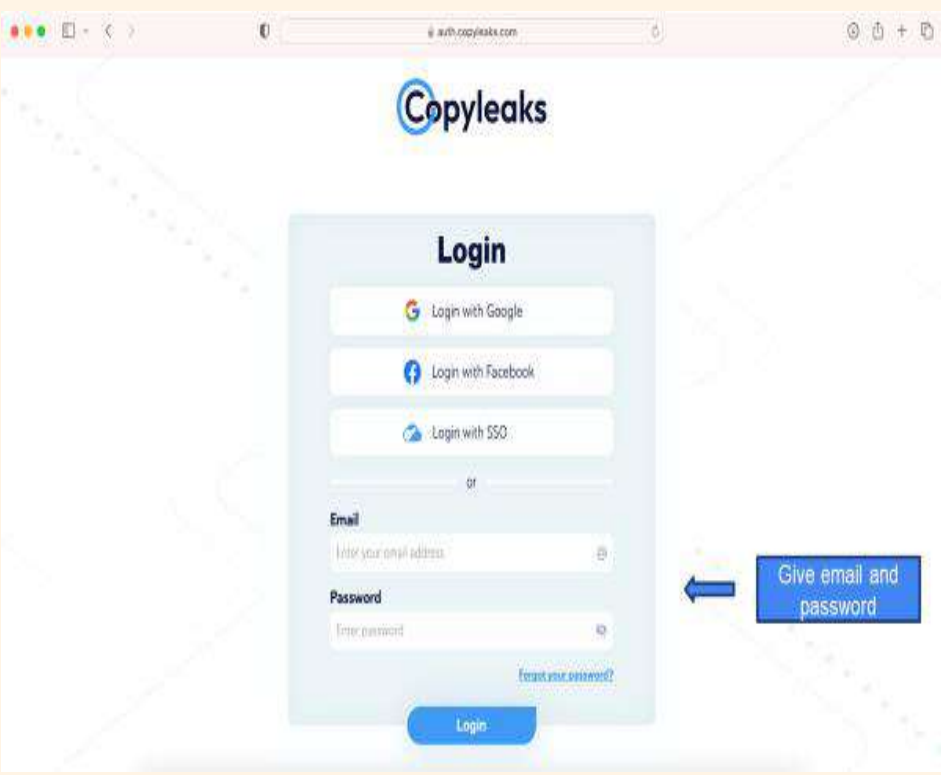
